If you have been following the news about federal funding for public media over the last few months, you are probably confused and increasingly frustrated. The current presidential administration has made it clear that it would like to eliminate funding for PBS, NPR, and local stations that was previously approved by Congress. The administration also continues to try to discredit the work we do for the American public.

As of this writing, we are still waiting for clarification on Trump's recent executive order to slash funds for NPR and PBS via the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB). Patricia Harrison, president and CEO of CPB explained that "CPB is not a federal executive agency subject to the President's authority. Congress directly authorized and funded CPB to be a private nonprofit corporation wholly independent of the federal government."

By the time you read this, the situation might have changed again, but the bottom line remains that federal funding for public media is currently at risk. This essential support makes up about 20% of Illinois Public Media's budget, and it helps us provide you with trusted journalism, educational programming, and lifesaving information during emergencies. Losing these funds would have a devastating impact on the local service we provide to central Illinois communities.

This is *your* public media station, so I encourage you to share your opinion with your congressional representatives and fellow community members. To get the latest information and learn how you can help, go to will.illinois.edu/protectwill.

During **Dino Week!** PBS presents new and encore programs that feature these iconic prehistoric creatures.

Walking with Dinosaurs headlines the week with a new series that reimagines one of the BBC's best-loved factual shows. The new sixpart series will air two episodes nightly at 7 pm Monday-Wednesday, June 16–18. It will be rebroadcast Wednesdays at 7 pm beginning June 25.

Narrated by Bertie Carvel, each episode will

tell the dramatic story of an individual dinosaur whose remains are currently being unearthed by the world's leading dinosaur hunters. Thanks to cutting-edge science, experts can reveal how these prehistoric creatures lived, hunted, fought, and died more accurately than ever before. The series will bring these prehistoric stories to life with state-of-the-art visual effects — making each episode a gripping dinosaur drama based on the very latest evidence. Across the six episodes, audiences will meet a range of spectacular dinosaur species in an array of prehistoric landscapes.

Other programs during **Dino Week!** include: **Nature** presents **Museum Alive with David Attenborough** (9 pm Monday, June 16) and **Attenborough and the Jurassic Sea Monster** (9 pm Tuesday, June 17); **Jurassic Fortunes** from **Secrets of the Dead** (10 pm Tuesday June 17); and **NOVA** presents **Alaskan Dinosaurs** (9 pm Wednesday, June 18) and **Dinosaur Apocalypse: The New Evidence** (10 pm Wednesday, June 18).

Exploring the impact of humans

Earth has never experienced anything like us: a single species dominating and transforming the planet. Biologist Shane Campbell-Staton travels the globe to explore our human footprint and to discover how the things we do reveal who we truly are. Part science series and part travel show, season 2 of **Human Footprint** tracks down invasive species, discovers the impact of the planet's top predator (humans!), discovers the profound impact of dogs on humans,



meets five species that made allies with humans, explores three thriving urban species, and explores the human footprint of cotton. The six-part series airs Wednesdays at 8 pm beginning June 25.

'Shelter Me' features local pet cancer trials

This month, **Shelter Me**, an Emmy Award-winning documentary series with heartwarming stories about pet dogs and the people who love them, shares national and local stories about groundbreaking clinical trials for dogs with cancer that are leading to new treatments for people.

Shelter Me: The Cancer Pioneers,

airing at 9 pm Monday, June 9, features leading scientists at the National Cancer Institute, National Institutes of Health, and academic universities across the country – including Timothy Fan, professor of veterinary medical oncology in the College of Veterinary Medicine and associate director for Translational Research and

Development at the Cancer Center at Illinois at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign.

"Training the immune system to fight cancer has made a tremendous impact on saving the lives of people over the past two decades," Fan said. "However, even with the best treatment options currently available, only a fraction of human cancer patients achieve long-lasting benefits.

"What is learned from clinical studies in pet dogs and cats with cancer can be rapidly translated to inform future human clinical studies, ultimately accelerating the development of immunotherapies that will have the greatest life-saving impacts for both pets and human cancer patients, alike.

"Making a positive impact on fighting cancer can start with a shared vision among veterinarians, physicians, and basic scientists. Valuing scientific discovery and clinical translation are essential to stoke the flames of innovation that can benefit both pets and people alike," Fan said.

Behind the scenes of 'Wolf Hall'

Wolf Hall: The Mirror and the Light – Reflections delves into the making of the original television series, Wolf Hall, and the sequel, The Mirror and the Light. Both series are based on Hilary Mantel's Booker Prize-winning trio of novels. In this special, cast members and creators discuss what it was like to return to filming a decade after the first series and how the passage of time



has influenced their view of 16th-century England. The program explores the series' locations and how modern production techniques brought the England of the 1520s to life. **Wolf Hall: The Mirror and the Light – Reflections** airs at 5:30 pm and 11 pm Sunday, June 8.



News Brews & Beatz: Community members discuss state of Black communities

In late April, Illinois Public Media hosted a panel discussion in the Collins Television Studio as part of its News, Brews & Beatz series.

Prominent community leaders from government and social justice, along with more than 50 guests turned out for the 10th edition of News, Brews & Beatz that focused on "The State of Champaign-Urbana's Black Communities through the lens of Black Leadership." Participants were able to learn more about the topic and to engage in conversation.

Guest panelists included Chief Larry Boone, Urbana Police Department; Rev. Rickey Parks, Pilgrim Missionary Baptist Church, Champaign; Joe Stovall, State Farm agent; and Jennifer Tatum, superintendent, Urbana School District #116. The discussion was co-hosted by Reginald Hardwick, IPM news and public affairs director; Tracy Parsons, facilitator for the Champaign County Community Coalition; and David Pierce, news reporter for IPM News. Jill Clements is the executive producer.

"Our guests provided insights into the challenges from the perspective of local classrooms and churches," Hardwick said. "Urbana police chief Larry Boone's discussion about the poverty he has witnessed and the neglect of some neighborhoods should be eye opening to all central Illinoisans. We hope the conversation will spur solutions."

Other key takeaways from the discussion included defining what Black leadership looks like today; the challenges and triumphs made over the last few years with local Black leadership in key city positions in business, policing, and education; along with identifying the three core local communities — the university recruit, the townie, and the boomeranger (those that were born here, left, and then returned home) — and their quality of living needs.

New student fellow joins IPM

Melissa "Mel" Bialecki Miller has joined the WILL Classical 90.9 FM team as the next John Frayne Classical Music Graduate Student Fellow.

Miller is a Ph.D. candidate at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign studying ethnomusicology with a minor in Russian, East European, and Eurasian Studies. Her dissertation research on Ukrainian popular music explores the variety of roles musicians play to support, disseminate, and perpetuate Ukrainian culture in the context of the Russian invasion. She is especially interested in how Ukrainian folk idioms are employed in popular music and how female musicians challenge and reshape ideas about gender during wartime. In 2023, she completed eight months of fieldwork in Warsaw, Poland, where she attended Ukrainian concerts and spoke with artists and diasporic audiences about the role of music during the war.

"I'm excited for this opportunity to bring classical music to the local community," Miller said. "My background is in academia, and what I've always found most rewarding about that work is education and outreach. Whenever I see a student enjoy a genre of music they might never have engaged with before, or realize something new about a piece they already enjoy, that's when I feel I've really done my job.

"Working with WILL feels like a natural extension of that work. I love talking about music, I love telling stories, and I'm looking forward to learning to do all of that through the medium of radio."

Although Miller possesses a strong background in classical music — she studied cello since she was 10 years old, performed in university and professional ensembles, and taught music from kindergarten to the undergraduate level — radio presents new territory for her.

"Classical radio is such an important and accessible means by which we bring this music to the community," she said. "So I'm looking forward to learning more about what goes into that and how to do it well."

She believes radio is one way we can counter the notion that classical music is an elitist art form. "You don't need to buy a concert ticket or find time to attend the symphony — all you need to listen is a home or car radio or internet access," she explained. "As someone from a small Midwestern town, I didn't have many opportunities to attend the opera or symphony growing up, so radio was where I began exploring classical music. Now, I'm grateful to be in a position where I can continue that cycle by bringing that music to others."

'MAG' fans attend taping at Allerton Park
